Our Mission: To tutor, guide, and inspire youth living in low-income and public housing to achieve academic success.

YTP Students: YTP serves 450-500 first through twelfth grade students each year at six tutoring centers in Seattle.

About YTP

YTP was started in 1991 as a partnership with the Seattle Housing Authority after resident families requested academic support for their youth. YTP tutoring centers provide youth with:

- An encouraging learning environment
- Structured, individualized tutoring sessions

We partner with families facing the challenges of financial need, racism, and limited English proficiency to help students overcome educational opportunity gaps.

94%

of YTP students come from families with incomes at or below 50% of the Area Median Income.

come from families where English is not the primary home language.

83%

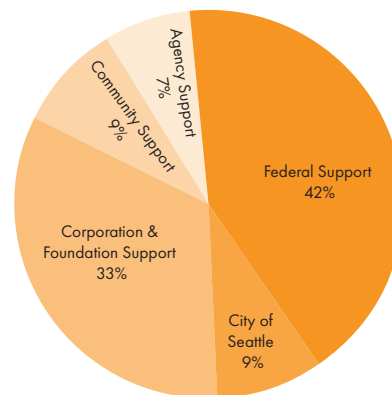
of YTP students come from immigrant and refugee families.
