## SHELTERS AND HOMELESS SERVICES

### NATIVITY HOUSE

253-502-2780

Serves men and women experiencing homelessness. The Day Shelter offers basic needs like warm meals and clothing, as well as mental health support, substance use disorder assessments and referrals to housing. The Overnight Shelter has 167 emergency beds for single individuals. Together, they operate 24/7/365 to help our neighbors become more stable and move toward housing.

### FAMILY HOUSING NETWORK

253-471-5340

Offers a continuum of services that help families experiencing homelessness obtain permanent housing. The target populations are families with children and military veteran households. Case managers work with families to offer a variety of housing solutions including diversion, rapid rehousing and permanent supportive housing. Operating 7 days a week, the drop-in Family Day Center provides a safe refuge with basic services such as showers, laundry, kitchen facilities, computer stations, and same day Coordinated Entry assessments.

### STABILITY SITE

The Stability Site provides 58 shelter units serving up to 100 individuals. Basic amenities including restrooms, garbage services, hand washing stations and drinking water. Case management services, access to food, and other supportive services including temporary employment are provided.

### PIERCE ADULT BEHAVIORAL HEALTH (ABH)

Adult Behavioral Health offers outpatient services to Medicaid enrollees requesting individual and group therapy, peer services and medication supports. ABH also offer housing supports through Foundational Community Supports. No referral necessary.

### PREGNANCY SUPPORT SERVICES

Assists women, men and families experiencing unplanned pregnancies, offering a range of professional services.

## PROGRAMS IN FAMILY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SYSTEM

### CRISIS STABILIZATION SERVICES FOR CHILDREN, YOUTH AND THEIR FAMILIES

Brief services, up to 90 days, are designed to achieve stabilization with families in crisis in order to avoid unnecessary psychiatric hospitalizations. During the crisis stabilization period, CCS provides an array of in-home support services including crisis response, safety/crisis assessment and treatment services. Through a wraparound framework, extended family, community and natural resources are combined with more traditional mental health services to bring about safety, stabilization, and community integration. Services are available twenty-four hours per day, seven days per week. Referrals are through Crisis Connections.





## HEALTH HOMES

Health Homes staff coordinate care for high risk children, youth as identified by a PRISM score of 1.5 or higher. Health Homes is a voluntary service option. As part of this service, CCS Care Coordinators will assist families with navigating and integrating their health care and social service needs, improve their overall health and wellbeing, and manage their chronic conditions. Care coordinators will focus on integrating the following services: Medical, Mental/Behavioral Health, Long Term Services and Supports and Community/Social Support.

## MOBILE CRISIS SERVICES FOR CHILDREN, YOUTH AND THEIR FAMILIES

Brief crisis resolution for all children and youth (under 18 years). Clinician meets the youth and family, assesses the immediate risk, and engages the youth and family in a process of crisis resolution and individualized safety planning. An agreed upon action plan is created with the family, and linkages to other helpful supports and services are initiated. Intervention typically runs less than 72 hours. Referrals are through Crisis Connections.

## WISE (WRAPAROUND WITH INTENSIVE SERVICES)

WiSe, is an approach to helping Medicaid-eligible children, youth, and their families with intensive mental health care. Services are available in home and community settings and offer a system of care based on the individualized need of the child or youth. WiSe is a voluntary service that takes a team approach to support you and your family in meeting your goals.

## SENIORS AND PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

### HOME CARE FOR ELDERLY AND PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

Home Care provides non-medical assistance to aging persons and those with disabilities living in their homes. Home Care Aides provide a range of services from housework, grocery shopping, and laundry to personal care such as dressing, bathing, and helping transfer from the bed. Care may be just a few hours a day, or around the clock. Bilingual staff available in Russian, Spanish, Polish, and Vietnamese.

### CAREGIVER TRAINING

The Caregiver Training Program provides Basic Training and ongoing Continuing Education for Home Care Aides throughout Washington. Nurse Delegation and Advanced Training are also provided. Training is provided by a team of state-approved instructors in multiple languages, including English, Spanish, Vietnamese, Russian and Korean.

### PIERCE COUNTY SENIOR FOOTCARE

Provides footcare to seniors based on sliding fee scale.

### SENIOR NUTRITION

Provides home-delivered meals to homebound seniors and 14 meal sites for community dining. Two meal sites specifically serve authentic, healthy Latino meals.

### VOLUNTEER SERVICES

Volunteers help low-income older adults and adults with disabilities remain living independent in their own homes by assisting with basic needs such as transportation, shopping, housework, and yard care.
