SHELTERS AND HOMELESS SERVICES

ANCHOR SHELTER

253-854-0077

Provides low barrier, harm reduction, enhanced shelter for adults and couples without children that are experiencing homelessness.

BRIDGE SHELTER PROGRAM

206-956-9563

Provides low barrier, harm reduction, enhanced shelter for adults and couples without children that are experiencing homelessness.

BUNNY WILBURN HOME

206-329-5433

24/7 shelter for women over the age of 18 who are currently homeless. Provides case management, three daily meals, showers, support and resources.

COMING HOME PROGRAM

206-328-5640

Assists participants during the initial period of placement in permanent housing. The program helps participants become solidly integrated in their community and develop a network of permanent, community-based connections to sustain them over time.

COORDINATED ENTRY REGIONAL ACCESS POINTS

COVINGTON SAFE CAR PARKING MINISTRY

Case management services for individuals living in their vehicle. Maximum of 6 vehicles in Covington.

CREW BEHAVIORAL HEALTH OUTREACH SERVICES

Provides engagement and outreach, peer support, case management, psychiatric medications, and substance use assessment for individuals and families living in homelessness, primarily in South King County. Funded through Public Health, services are provided on the streets, in jails, at hospitals, in shelters, or as needed.

Engage Health is a partnership between CCS, King County Public Health and the University of Washington Harborview. The two clinic locations, Kent and Federal Way, provide comprehensive, preventative healthcare for people living in poverty in South King County.

F-SHARP (FAMILY SERVICES AND HOUSING TO ACCESS RECOVERY PROGRAM)

800-621-4636

Serves families experiencing homelessness in King County with serious mental illness and co-occurring substance use disorders with case management and treatment services. All enrollments must be referred by Coordinated Entry for All.

FEDERAL WAY DAY CENTER

253-893-7895

A welcoming space for adults and families in Federal Way experiencing homelessness. Provides showers, laundry and space for meal preparation. Guests can also access case management services, community resources, health care and social services.

HOUSING AND ESSENTIAL NEEDS (HEN)

206-328-5755

A rental/utility assistance, transportation assistance and basic needs program for adults with a disability and no income, or who receive the ABD cash benefit program, as determined by the Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS).

ISSAQUAH MEALS

A free weeknight hot dinner meal in Issaquah for individuals and families, no questions asked.

JUNCTION POINT

Provides low barrier, harm reduction, enhanced shelter for adults and couples without children that are experiencing homelessness.

KATHERINE'S HOUSE

A 6-unit transitional housing program in Kent for homeless adult women in recovery from drugs and alcohol.

KENT COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT CENTER

Provides day services to homeless and vulnerable people in the Kent

area. Hygiene services including showers and laundry, and space for meal preparation and community connections.

NATIVE AMERICAN MEN'S HOUSE

Clean and sober housing in Seattle for 6 homeless Native American men offering an environment of tradition and culture.

NEW BETHLEHEM PLACE

425-679-0354

Provides families experiencing homelessness with a welcoming space 24/7 through its day center, hotel partners, and overnight shelter. Services include case management, meals, showers, and laundry.

PALO STUDIOS

15 units of permanent housing in Seattle for adults directly referred from The Inn for those who have disabilities and need ongoing supportive services.

PARKE STUDIOS

20 units of permanent housing in Seattle for adults referred from Coordinated Entry for All.

Rental and moving assistance for families experiencing homelessness in King County. All enrollments must be referred by Coordinated Entry for All.

RAPID RE-HOUSING FOR SINGLE ADULTS (MEN & WOMEN)

Short-term rental and moving cost assistance for homeless single adults in King County. All enrollments must be referred by Coordinated Entry for All.

RITA'S HOUSE

A 6-unit transitional housing program in Auburn for homeless adult women in recovery from drugs and alcohol.

SACRED HEART SHELTER

A service enriched shelter in Kent for families experiencing homelessness.

SCOPE (SEATTLE COMMUNITY OUTREACH PROGRAM & ENGAGEMENT)

An outreach and engagement program in select Starbucks stores in Seattle. This program provides street-based case management and outreach services to adults living outdoors in the greater Seattle area.

FAMILY AND YOUTH SERVICES

FOSTER CARE

253-502-2745

Actively recruits and certifies adults willing to provide temporary care to foster children.

KINSHIP SERVICES

206-328-6858

Information, resources and services for family members raising their relatives' children, reducing caregiver stress and improving the children's well-being.

YOUTH TUTORING PROGRAM (YTP) 206-328-5953

An after-school academic enrichment program for students who live in low and mixed-income housing communities in Seattle: Jackson Park, Yesler Terrace, Rainier Vista, High Point, New Holly and Lake Washington Apartments.

PROGRAMS IN FAMILY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SYSTEM

CREW (COUNSELING, RECOVERY AND WELLNESS PROGRAM) 206-956-9570

Licensed outpatient behavioral health counseling services for King County residents primarily covered by Medicaid. Offered services include assessments, individual counseling, group therapy, psychiatric services, peer support, and case management. Locations in Seattle, Kent, Kirkland and Federal Way.

FOUNDATIONAL COMMUNITY SUPPORTS 206-799-9882

Supportive Housing and Supportive Employment services aimed to help Medicaid-covered adults find and maintain housing, employment, or both through the use of case management, care planning, resume building, skills training and linkages with community resources.

"INCREDIBLE YEARS" EVIDENCED BASED PARENTING CLASSES 253-850-2500

The Incredible Years class is an essential support for families at-risk for involvement in Child Protective Services, those looking forward to reunification after foster care, and parents looking to increase their parenting skills and strengthen their bonds with their children. In our class, parents learn evidence-based, effective positive-discipline techniques. The group setting allows parents to build supportive relationships and problem-solve shared parenting barriers.

WISE (WRAPAROUND WITH INTENSIVE SERVICES) 253-850-2513

WISe is an approach to helping Medicaid-eligible children, youth, and their families with intensive mental health care. Services are available in-home and community settings and offer a system of care based on the individualized need of the child or youth. WISe is a voluntary service that takes a team approach to supporting clients and their families in meeting your goals.

SENIORS AND PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

AFRICAN AMERICAN ELDERS PROGRAM 206-328-5639

Identifies frail, isolated and hard-to-serve elder African Americans by assisting them in accessing and receiving needed social and health services through ongoing case management, medication, support and referrals. Services available in Central/South Seattle and South King County.

HOME CARE FOR ELDERS AND PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES 800-219-0335

Home Care provides non-medical assistance to aging persons and those with disabilities living in their homes. Home Care Aides provide a range of services from housework, grocery shopping, and laundry to personal care such as dressing, bathing, and helping transfer from the bed. Care may be just a few hours a day, or around the clock. Bilingual staff available in Russian, Spanish, Polish, and Vietnamese.

CAREGIVER TRAINING 360-417-5420

The Caregiver Training Program provides Basic Training and ongoing Continuing Education for Home Care Aides throughout Washington. Nurse Delegation and Advanced Training are included. Training is provided by a team of state-approved instructors in multiple languages, including English, Spanish, Vietnamese, Russian and Korean.

PEARLS 206-328-5639

Pearls is an in-home counseling program that teaches depression management techniques to older adults experiencing minor depression. The program serves all ethnic groups throughout Seattle and King County.

SENIOR NUTRITION 253-474-1300

Provides 10 meal sites for community dining, including five meal sites serving authentic, healthy Latino meals.

VOLUNTEER SERVICES 206-328-5787

Volunteers help low-income older adults and adults with disabilities remain living independent in their own homes by assisting with basic needs such as transportation, shopping, housework, and yard care.

VETERANS SERVICES

MICHAEL'S PLACE 206-726-5688

An 18-unit transitional housing community in Seattle for male veterans with onsite clinical and housing case management.

SUPPORTIVE SERVICES FOR VETERANS FAMILIES PROGRAM (SSVF) 206-518-0018 or 206-858-1148

Case management, rapid rehousing and homelessness prevention assistance for very low income veterans and veteran families in King County.

ADDITIONAL SERVICES

ASPIRING SOCIAL SERVICES EMPLOYEE TRAINING (ASSET) 206-773-3342

An employment preparation program for CCS/CHS clients/residents who are interested in developing skills and knowledge to complement their lived experiences to work in housing and homeless service organizations. ASSET is a CCSKC agency-wide effort with staff serving as teachers and supervisors and with program counsel and case management throughout graduates' training, goal attainment and employment transitions.

CATHOLIC IMMIGRATION LEGAL SERVICES 206-328-5714 or 206-328-6314

Legal immigration assistance to low-income residents of Washington. Services are provided in multiple languages including Somali, Russian and Spanish.

CEDARS PROGRAM

Case management for formerly homeless veteran adults in 10 housing units in Renton.

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

ORCA LIFT PROGRAM

Lift is a low-income ORCA card that provides users with a reduced fare for Metro transit, Sound transit, and Community transit. Enrollment options are based on qualifying eligibility.

MATT TALBOT CENTER

A faith-based recovery treatment center for people who are struggling with addiction, mental illness, or homelessness.

PROJECT RACHEL

Provides healing and support in a confidential environment for women and men who have experienced abortion.

CASE MANAGEMENT CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

A CCS partnership with Highline Community College and other housing and homeless services organizations that provides college opportunities to entry level frontline employees who often have experienced access barriers of poverty, homelessness and structural racism. Financial aid and case management supports employees as students pursuing professional development and career advancement through higher education.

SSI NAVIGATOR

Works with clients of CCS/CHS programs who need assistance in applying for Social Security disability benefits.

SUNSET COURT PROGRAM

Case management services for formerly homeless families in 10 housing units in Renton.

TENANT LAW CENTER – EVICTION PREVENTION
