SHELTERS AND HOMELESS SERVICES

ARREST AND JAIL ALTERNATIVES

360-660-2281

Arrest and Jail Alternatives works in close partnership with the Olympia Police Department. AJA uses peer navigators to assist homeless and housing-insecure adults in the community who are at risk of passing through the criminal justice system and have complex health and behavioral problems.

DREXEL HOUSE SHELTER

Provides temporary shelter and Case Management for 16 men experiencing homelessness.

HOPE VILLAGE

Hope Village is a medium-barrier site that houses eight individuals struggling with homelessness in downtown Olympia.

HOUSING AND ESSENTIAL NEEDS (HEN)

Housing and Essential Needs (HEN) may provide non-cash housing and other assistance for recipients of DSHS Medical Care Services (MCS), with a referral from DSHS, that are experiencing homelessness or at risk of experiencing homelessness.

QUINCE STREET VILLAGE

Quince Street Village is a low-barrier shelter site in downtown Olympia housing 100 individuals experiencing homelessness while connecting them to permanent housing resources.

THE COMMUNITY KITCHEN (LOCATED AT THE SALVATION ARMY SITE)

The Community Kitchen serves a nutritious lunch and dinner six days a week – Monday through Saturday – all year long at 808 5th Ave SE. The Kitchen also provides meals during the week to teens at Rose’s Place and one meal each weekday to veterans, people without homes and others at Drexel House.

FAMILY AND YOUTH SERVICES

CRISIS STABILIZATION SERVICES FOR CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND THEIR FAMILIES

Brief services, up to 8 weeks, are designed to achieve stabilization with families in crisis in order to avoid unnecessary psychiatric hospitalizations. During the crisis stabilization period, CCS provides an array of in-home support services including crisis response, safety/crisis assessment and ccsww.org treatment services. Through a wraparound framework, extended family, community and natural resources are combined with more traditional mental health services to bring about safety, stabilization, and community integration. Services are available twenty-four hours per day, seven days per week. Referrals are through Crisis Connections.

INTERNATIONAL FOSTER CARE

Provides a safe, nurturing environment for children who have fled their countries of origin. Services are also available in Spanish.

MENTAL HEALTH AND RECOVERY SERVICES

THURSTON ADULT BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

Thurston Adult Behavioral Health provides outpatient mental health services including peer support, individual and group therapy, and psychiatric medication management to current residents and participants of other local CCS programs such as Quince St. Village, Hope Village, Drexel House, Foundational Community Supports, Arrest and Jail Alternatives, and Housing and Essential Needs. Referrals from CCS staff are required.

WISE (WRAPAROUND WITH INTENSIVE SERVICES)

WISe is an approach to helping Medicaid-eligible children, youth, and their families with intensive mental health care. Services are available in-home and community settings and offer a system of care based on the individualized need of the child or youth. WISe is a voluntary service that takes a team approach to supporting clients and their families in meeting your goals.

SENIORS AND PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

CAREGIVER TRAINING

The Caregiver Training Program provides Basic Training and ongoing Continuing Education for Home Care Aides throughout Washington. Nurse Delegation and Advanced Training are included. Training is provided by a team of state-approved instructors in multiple languages, including English, Spanish, Vietnamese, Russian, and Korean.

HOME CARE FOR ELDERS AND PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

Home Care provides assistance to aging persons and those with disabilities to assist them living in their homes. Licensed Home Care Aides provide personal care such as dressing, bathing, toilet use, medication management, personal hygiene, vital signs, assistance with walking, and helping transfer from the bed. Care may be just a few hours a day, or around the clock. Bilingual staff available in Russian, Spanish, and Vietnamese.
